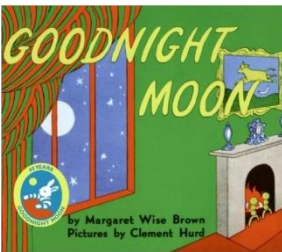
Filled with soft, beautiful watercolor artwork and lilted text, this lift-the-flap book about all the great things fathers do is perfect for young children. - *Amazon*

By Trish Cooke

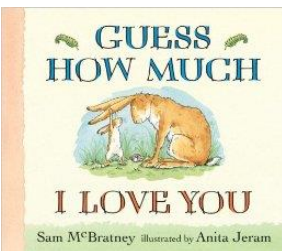

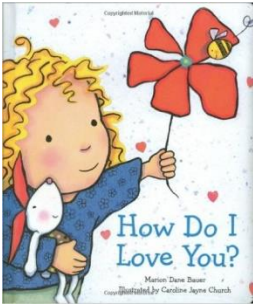
### Guess How Much I Love You

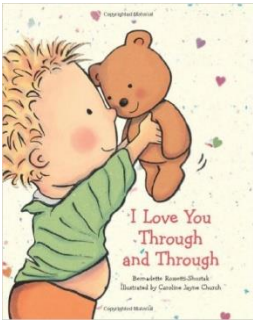

By Marion Dane Bauer

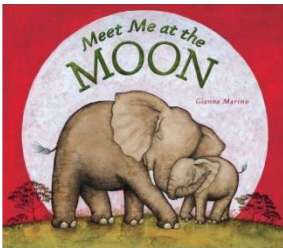

By Bernadette Rossetti Shustak

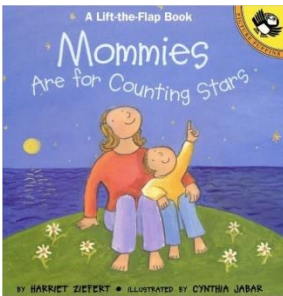
A rhyming story of unconditional love and adorable illustrations of a toddler and a teddy bear who declare "I love you through and through!" - *Amazon*

By Gianna Marino

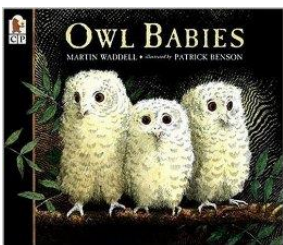
