At Forty Carrots Preschool, the whole child – social, emotional, creative, physical and cognitive development – is nurtured through a developmentally appropriate, play-based, creative curriculum. Highly trained teachers balance spontaneous, guided and self-directed play to set the scene for literacy, language and mathematical development as well as positive social interactions (caring, sharing, cooperating) and self-esteem. Graduates leave with the social skills, academic knowledge and love for learning that set the stage for future success. Accreditation by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC) signifies that The Preschool at Forty Carrots Family Center provides the highest quality childhood experience.

Forty Carrots Family Center is a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization dedicated to strengthening families through educational programs for parents, children and professionals in the field. The agency serves families from North Port to Bradenton. Now in its 20th year, Forty Carrots is Sarasota's only agency whose singular focus is early childhood and parenting education.
